When you are looking at some of these websites, explore a little bit. You may find all sorts of goodies.

When a website has a Gallery link, it usually has scrapbook pages that have been posted by their members, subscribers, or users to show their work.

Some sites have tutorials or forums where you can find information or get help from others with the software you use or ideas on ways to do things to improve your pages.

My biggest caution about templates and galleries is that the pages tend to be all show and no story. Since I believe that it is more important to tell the story than it is to produce volumes of pages with many pictures while sacrificing the story, I would suggest that you either modify the designs to allow for more text or you opt for simpler pages and not use templates or copy designs too closely.

Also, keep in mind that one can create great books without using any of the color and design elements discussed. If you write the story in a manner that is interesting and include selected pictures to illustrate that story, you can print it on plain, white paper and later generations will be happy to read it. Remember to include the who, what, where, when, why, and how.
